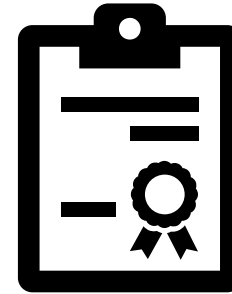

BUCKET #1: MOST / FASTT TEAMS: 4 PROJECTS



BUCKET #2: MENTAL HEALTH COURT AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE: 3 PROJECTS



BUCKET #3: TRAINING / EMPLOYMENT: 3 PROJECTS

Bucket #1: MOST / FASTT Teams



PARTNERSHIP DOUGLAS COUNTY

- MOST: Increase service to 10 new contacts
- MOST: Increase service to 20 follow-up contacts / month
- FASTT: Increase service to 10-low risk offenders / month
- FASTT: 30-day post release case plan follow-up



LYON COUNTY HUMAN SERVICES

- FASTT: 50% FASTT clients existing jail are assigned to a PSSR or CHW

Bucket #1: MOST / FASTT Teams



COMMUNITY CHEST, INC – STOREY COUNTY



COMMUNITY CHEST, INC – MINERAL COUNTY

- Number of MOST / FASTT calls / month
- Number of follow-up contacts
- Number of care plans created
- Number of follow-up contacts regarding care plans

Bucket #2: Mental Health Court and Substance Abuse Disorders



LAS VEGAS MUNICIPAL COURT: MENTAL HEALTH COURT

- Increase MHC participants by 10 from 30-40
- Set higher retention goals
- Better data gathering and analysis to improve retention and recidivism



CARSON CITY JUSTICE / MUNICIPAL COURT: MENTAL HEALTH COURT

- Increase MHC participants by 10 from 35-45
- Number of individual treatment plans created and followed
- Number and types of supportive services clients utilized

Bucket #2: Mental Health Court and Substance Abuse Disorders



RIDGE HOUSE

- Creating a brand-new program
 - Number of candidates applying for the new program from prison
 - Number of participants in new program
 - Hours of intensive outpatient programming completed
 - Relationship repair

Bucket #3: Training/Employment



HUMBOLDT COUNTY HUMAN SERVICES

- Increase rate of employment upon return to the community
- Secure employment documents: ID, SSC, Birth Certificate



CITY OF NORTH LAS VEGAS: YOUTH COURT

- Training cohorts = 3
- Supportive services
- Key interventions

FOUNDATION FOR AN INDEPENDENT TOMORROW (FIT)

- Number of candidates applying for FIT programming
- Number of individual employment plans
- Number of candidates taking advantage of added training services
- Supportive services
- Relationship repair
