

Nevada Local Justice Reinvestment (NLJR) Grant

2024 Grant Funding by County

The Nevada Department of Sentencing Policy (NDSP) encouraged entities across the state to submit grant applications for the NLJR Grant. There was \$3 million total to be granted. The initial Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) only yielded 5 grant applications for a total of \$456,001 in granted state funds. Five additional rounds of funding were created through June 21, 2024, and the entire \$3 million was granted and recipients had a 1-year performance window.

When it became apparent that \$925,963 in granted funds were going to be returned, a seventh round of funding was created with a three-month performance window from April 1 through June 30, 2025.

County Funding:

One focus of the NLJR grant funds was to fund reentry/recidivism projects in every Nevada county. The next table shows county activities for this grant funding; all seven rounds of funding are included, broken out by county or jurisdiction.

Please note that the “Amount Granted” column includes the “State Award” and “Agency Match” amounts. In addition, the “State Award”* column total of \$3,781,395 appears to exceed the available \$3 million. This is because \$925,963 was returned from Rounds 1-6 and regranted in Round 7. The “State Funding Spent” was \$2,672,569 and the remaining \$327,431 was returned to the State of Nevada.
