








## **AVERAGE TIME ON PAROLE**






## Resources and Support Needs


We talked about resources and support earlier—What helped the most? What, if anything, would have made a bigger difference?






With the passage of Assembly Bill 236 (2019), NRS 213.142.4.b, the Parole Board may temporarily revoke parole supervision and impose a term of imprisonment for technical violations. This allows up to 30 days for a first temporary revocation, 90 days for the second, and 180 days for the third.

The data on the following slides is for the 28 offenders who have been temporarily revoked three times between July 2020 and February 2023.





On average offenders in this data set spent less time on supervision with each subsequent release.

- 66.4% decrease in time in community from
  1<sup>st</sup> supervision period to 2<sup>nd</sup> supervision period
- 41.3% decrease in time in community from
  2<sup>nd</sup> supervision period to 3<sup>rd</sup> supervision period
