AB 32

- Summary (as introduced)
 - Creates intermediate jail and electronic monitoring sanctions for temporary revocations for both probation and parole
 - Revises definition of technical violation for sex offenders
 - Changes duties of NDSP executive director
 - Modify membership of NSC
- Bill hearings
 - Assembly Judiciary on February 15, 2023
 - Senate Judiciary on May 1, 2023
- Amendments
 - Revised definition of technical violation for sex offenders
 - Collect data related to homelessness
 - Confidentiality for data collection
 - Authorized Coordinating Council to accept gifts and grants
 - Credit for time served waiting for technical violations
- Status
 - Passed out of Assembly Judiciary and Assembly
 - Work session in Senate Judiciary pending

- Passed out of Assembly Judiciary
- Work session in Ways and Means pending

SB 103

- Summary

- Require the NSC to study misdemeanors and submit a report to the 2025 Legislature
- Amend NSC duties
- Amend NSC membership

- Bill Hearing

- Senate Judiciary on February 13, 2023

- Amendments

- None

- Status

- Passed out of Senate Judiciary
- Referred to Senate Finance

SB 316

- Summary (as introduced)

- Revise information submitted by district attorneys to the Attorney General concerning cases filed for murder and voluntary manslaughter charges

- Bill Hearing

- Senate Judiciary on March 29, 2023
- Assembly Judiciary on May 11, 2023

- Amendments

- Require the information be submitted to the Nevada Department of Sentencing Policy rather than the Attorney General

- Status

- Passed out of Senate Judiciary and Senate
- Work session in Assembly Judiciary pending

SB 413

- Summary (as introduced)

- Changes credits earned while incarcerated in NDOC to a percentage
- Each person incarcerated in NDOC is allowed 25% of sentence for complying with programming in case plan

- Bill Hearing

- Senate Judiciary on April 7, 2023

- Amendments

- Change to 35%

- Status

- Passed out of Senate Judiciary
- Referred to Senate Finance

Other Legislative Activities

- Tracking other bills related to sentencing, criminal justice policy, corrections, reentry, and other agency administration
- Budget closing
- Conduct other data analysis upon request by agencies, legislators, the Governor's Office, and other stakeholders
